



Brief Recap:

Tasks Breakdown

Before starting my capstone project, I took some time to rewatch videos and refresh my knowledge of HTML and related web development skills, since it had been a while since I last used them. Once I felt ready, I began creating content by writing seven different blog posts. My mom and I also went out to take original photos to include each post. I built the blog using HTML files and styled everything with CSS to make each page visually appealing. In addition to the individual blog posts, I created an "About Me" page and a main blog page that links to all the posts I've written. Overall, I'm happy with how the project turned out. I had originally planned to write 15–20 posts, but I quickly realized that the process was more time-consuming than I had expected. Each post took several hours to write, format, and pair with images, plus another 1–2 hours to fully integrate into the website. Even though I completed fewer posts than I initially planned, I'm proud of the quality and effort behind each one. Looking ahead, I'm excited about the possibility of adding more pages and continuing to build on this project in the future.



As said above I originally planned for 15-20 posts, but only got two finishing 7.






